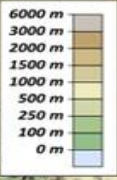

Historical Events	Roman Emperors
	Augustus (27 BC-14 AD)
Judea becomes a Roman Imperial Province	Tiberius (14-37 AD)
Pontius Pilate procurator of Judea	
Herod Agrippa appointed king of Judea by Tiberius	
Herod Agrippa appointed by Claudius king of ALL Judea (includes Samaria & other provinces)	Gaius (37-41 AD) also called Caligula
Famine in Judea documented by Josephus	Claudius (41-54 AD)
March 16, date of Herod's death	
51-52 AD Claudius expels Jews from Rome	
Felix procurator of Judea 52 – 59 AD, Festus replaces him	Nero (54-68 AD)
Festus procurator of Judea Burrhus prefect in Rome	
Great Fire in Rome July 64 AD, Christians blamed	
Beginning of Jewish revolt against Rome	Vespasian (69-79 AD)
Fall of Jerusalem, Destruction of the temple

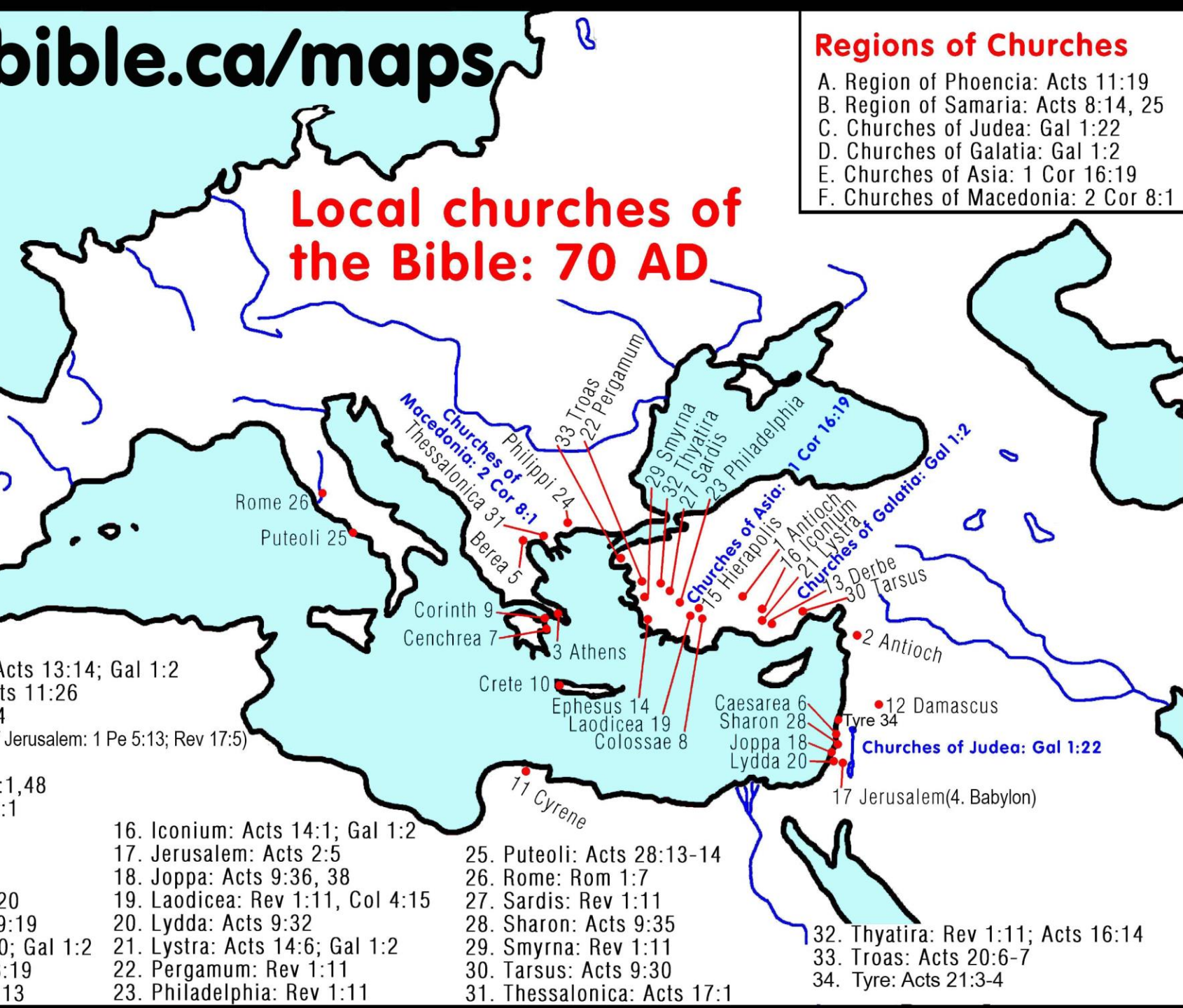
