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1 Samuel 16: 1-22 (Samual anoints David, David as Saul's musician)

The latter part of Saul's Reign was after Samuel's Death. Samuel has a hard time dealing with the person that Saul had become, but still had strong feelings for him.

Samuel's instruction to anoint David would have been a challenging task for him. David was probably 16-18 years old at this time, yet he did not become king till he was 30 years old. A lot of things happened during this time, much of which is covered in the rest of Samuel 1.

The anointing of David

- **16: 1** "How long will you mourn for Saul?
 - **##** What state of mind would Samuel have been in at this time? Had he not thought that his mentoring of Saul's kingship would the final stage of his long ministry? He was quite old by now.
- 16: 2-13 "If Saul hears of it, he will kill me."
 - ## Was he right to be afraid of Saul?
 - ## Why were the Elders afraid of Samuel?
 - ## The offering of Sacrifice was a priestly duty!
 - ## Are there times when DECEPTION is advisable?
 - ## Was the Anointing of David, a restricted activity to the family of Jesse?
 - v.13 "David was anointed by Samuel in the presence of his brothers".
 - ## How do you think they would react to this situation?
